The minimum package for students 2019-2020 is a 5-year financial package that includes an annual stipend, a fee scholarship and health insurance. The stipend for the first year is \$26,966 and comes in two parts: a teaching assistantship (consisting of a 10-month stipend of \$21,766) and summer support (\$5,200, available through a summer fellowship or teaching assistantship). A summer fellowship requires enrollment in at least 1 credit hour. A summer assistantship requires the student to be on campus during the summer.

The annual stipend paid to teaching assistants is considered taxable income. The fee scholarship, which covers tuition and related fees, is non-taxable and will cover a minimum of 90% of the credit hour fees for a resident and a minimum of 95% for a non-resident. This means students should be prepared to pay the remaining percentage of credit hour fees plus any mandatory or course-related fees, which amount to approximately \$2,400 (\$1,200 per semester). Many of these fees provide students with free access to things such as bus transportation in town, computers across campus, IU activities, and services at the campus clinic (in addition to the healthcare plan). Based on the 2019-2020 nonresident tuition rates, the fee scholarship component of our offer has an annual monetary value of approximately \$38,418. The support package also includes student health insurance (medical and dental) that is currently worth \$3,116.

Our teaching assistant work up to 20 hours per week during the academic year assisting one or more of our faculty members with their class work. Support for subsequent years is guaranteed provided you maintain a minimum GPA of 3.3 and satisfactory progress towards the degree.

The Clinical Science program also provides \$400 per academic year to each student for travel expenses.

Looking ahead – We are delighted to announce that the College of Arts and Sciences and the IU Bloomington campus have worked together to create a plan that will reduce graduate tuition fees for students who receive a College fee remission.

Beginning in Fall 2020, this plan will immediately reduce fees for graduate students with College fee remissions. The support will cover all fees not tied to specific campus services, such as technology, transportation, or the student health fee. This step would typically reduce a funded graduate student's tuition costs by \$1,100 per year.
